

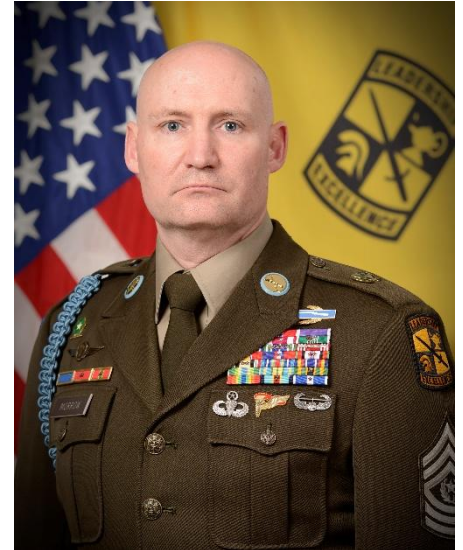


COMMAND SERGEANT BRYAN R. MORROW
