SUBJECT: Cadet Summer Training Policy Memorandum 4 – Uniform Code of Military Justice (UCMJ) for Soldiers and Discipline for Department of the Army Civilians

1. References.

- a. Army Regulation 27-10 (Military Justice).
- b. AR 690-752 (Disciplinary and Adverse Actions).
- c. Fort Knox Supplement to Army Regulation 27-10 (Legal Services: Military Justice).

2. Purpose. To provide command policy for the application of the UCMJ and disciplinary actions for civilian employees supporting CST.

3. UCMJ Authority.

- a. The Commanding General, USACC, has retained the authority to impose punishment for all officers, warrant officers, and enlisted Soldiers in the grade of E-8 and above within the command, under the provisions of Article 15, UCMJ. This authority may be delegated.
- b. The CST Commandant has withheld the authority to impose punishment for all Cadets and enlisted Soldiers in the grade of E-7 and below within the command, under the provision of Article 15, UCMJ. This authority may be delegated.
- c. Cadre members from Western Hemisphere Command (WHC) and USAR units shall be subject to the UCMJ authority of their units of assignment. USACC may request transfer of this authority.

4. DA Civilians. The CST Commandant has the authority to determine that Civilian personnel are excluded from CST training areas on a temporary or permanent basis in coordination with the USACC Labor Attorney and CHRAAs outlined in paragraph.

5. Leaders must coordinate with the USACC CST Legal Advisor for UCMJ actions. Leaders must coordinate with the USACC Labor Attorney and CHRA before considering action against a civilian employee.
